However, in contribution towards the 6 semester hours of coursework completed abroad required to fulfill this option, students may pursue courses that fulfill general education categories, so long as the course is not meant to fulfill another component of the certificate (e.g. POLI:1500 – Intro to International Relations fulfills the International and Global Issues gen ed category; however, it cannot be used for credit towards both the Cultural Immersion Option #2 component *and* the Global Politics component of the certificate—students must choose one or the other).
